Valerie attended Haskell Indian College. Then went on to receive a Master of Education degree from the University of Texas, El Paso. From there she was an elementary school teacher for 23 years. Teaching on the Apache and Navajo reservations in Arizona.

Valerie is a Chief Cornplanter descendent. She is an accomplished basket maker. Valerie has lectured at the Heard Museum in Phoenix, AZ. As well as various schools in the surrounding Western New York area when she served as the Curator of Education for the Seneca-Iroquois National Museum.

Her professional interest focus on native children education. Her current project includes a pop-up book in the Seneca language for beginning readers.
