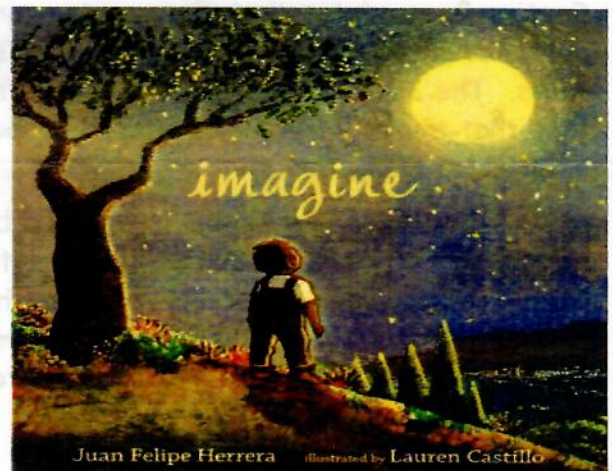
##### IMAGINE YOUR STORY

The 2020 Census counts every person living in the United States and five U.S. territories.

The count is mandated by the constitution and conducted by the US Census Bureau, a nonpartisan government agency.

The census provides critical data that lawmakers, business owners, teachers, and many others use to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community. Every year billions of dollars in federal funding go to hospitals, fire departments schools, roads, and other resources based on census data. The results of the census also determine the number of seats each state will have in the US House of Representatives, and they are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts.

It's also in the Constitution: Article 1, Section 2, mandates that the country conduct a count of its population once every 10 years. The 2020 Census will mark the 24th time that the country has counted its population since 1790.

Participating in the census is required by law. A complete and accurate count is critical for you and your community, because the results of the 2020 Census will affect community funding, congressional representation and more.

ARE YOU AWARE OF SOME OF OUR LAWS

**DOG LEASH LAW.** Dogs are not permitted to run at large in the Village. All dogs must be confined to their own property unless on a leash.

PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG IF YOU TAKE HIM FOR A WALK

**OPEN BURNING** Prohibited State-Wide! Small campfires are allowed.

NEVER LEAVE A BURNING FIRE UNATTENDED

**BUILDING PERMITS** Building permits are required in the Village. Please check with the Building Code Officer, Dave Crossley 640-3093 **BEFORE** you start your project.

**CURFEW:** All individuals under the age of 18 **MUST** be off the Village Streets from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

**RUBBISH AND GARBAGE:** Garbage or rubbish can no be stored or accumulated on any premises in the Village. Exterior property must be kept free from conditions which could create health or safety hazards or fire.
