ADMINISTRATIVE

The library will be closed on Friday, July 4th for Independence Day.

BEAUTIFICATION AND DISPLAYS

Decorating the library for the summer reading program has begun with a colorful and welcoming entrance to the children's room and giant Lego guessing game.

DONATIONS

<u>The Rainbow Sheep</u>, a children's picture book by David Hayward, was donated by Homestead resident Karen Oberst. This title will be an excellent addition in time for the Summer Reading Program theme "Color Our World."

Local historian and author Vince Martonis donated copies of his books: <u>The Caleb Mathews Redware Pottery of Gerry</u>, <u>The Fenton and Whittemore Redware Pottery of Mayville</u>, <u>Jamestown and Fluvanna</u>, and <u>The Haven and Kenyon Redware Pottery of Sheridan</u>.

The Northern Chautauqua Community Foundation donated two copies of My Side of the River by Elizabeth Camarillo Gutierrez in support of the YMCA/CHQ Book Read initiative.

FUNDRAISING 1

The library participated in the Give Big CHQ fundraising event and raised a little over \$1,500 (\$485.00 last year). Thank you to those trustees who made donations to this online fundraiser. We qualified for a portion of the stretch pool: \$153.11 included in the total above). 1

GRANTS 1

\$500.00 was received from CCLS in response to our Summer Reading Program minigrant application, which was prepared by Library Assistant Huling. The final report and all receipts will be due by September 12th. 1

The grant agreement was signed and returned to the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation to accept \$2,121.52 from their Blossom Fund for the purchase of a new copier/fax machine.

OUTREACH 2

The Library Director delivers library materials to residents at The Homestead in Gerry and conducts monthly book club and life story writing programs there. Once a month the Director provides a display table at the Sinclairville Fire Hall Senior Dining Program, where participants may borrow and return materials. 2

Assistant Huling will conduct outreach throughout the community as part of the "Mobile Summer Reading Program" with weekly visits to the Little Seeds Preschool Program, and Summer Recreation Programs in both Sinclairville and Gerry. Story Walks have been installed at both the Sinclairville and Gerry Town Parks as another way to reach out to these communities. 2

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Director Hadley is the recipient of a Circle Scholarship for teachers and librarians through the Alumni Association of the Chautauqua Literary and Scientific Circle at Chautauqua Institution. With this award, she will attend writing class at Chautauqua June 30-July 4 and share what is learned with participants in writing programs at the library. 4

The request was approved and Story Walk for the title <u>Harry the Dirty Dog</u> by Gene Zion has been installed by Assistant Huling.

On a Saturday after one of the school field trips, a girl brought her father back to the library to use our MakerSpace and other fun things. The library provided them with a space to enjoy their time of visitation.

STATISTICS

With 197 digital checkouts through the Libby platform during the month of May, our library ranked 16 out of the 38 member libraries. 154 new library cards were issued to CVCS students this school year as a result of the school field trips outreach initiative funded by the ALA/LTC grant (Round 2).

TECHNOLOGY & EQUIPMENT

The new copier/fax machine has been ordered to replace the HP 4050 TN that is over twenty years old. We will be getting a Canon ImageRUNNER DX C259iF from Usherwood Office Technology at the listed NYS Contract price of \$2,121.52, which is the amount of the grant received from CRCF's Blossom Fund. We have agreed to transition to DFT for our phone service as part of the CCLS collaborative initiative. Our phone number will stay the same, and we will gain a separate fax line with a different number.
